Salford Foundation is the lead partner, providing committed case workers to young people. We offer

practical support, advocacy and information. Pro-active work is undertaken with young people to build their skills, confidence and resilience – ensuring they can resettle and progress effectively. ADAPT work with public sector partners and local businesses to develop 'opportunity hubs' which will provide developmental and vocational opportunities for ex-offenders. Young people will have the opportunities to develop vocational skills in inspirational working environments, providing them with tangible progression routes and increased aspirations.
